Messages from Teachers

Reception

Another busy week in Reception! We have started our Read Write Inc sessions this week and the children are starting to learn some initial sounds. Next week we will be starting Number Time. The children have spent lots of time outside and have been enjoying the lovely weather. They really like playing in the water and playing with the large wooden blocks.

Year 1

This week Year 1 has continued with our exciting Gruffalo writing work. We have acted out the story, rearranged mixed up sentences and even written our own sentences to match pictures from the story. In maths we have carried on with our place value work with a focus on more than, less than and counting forward/backwards. The children have been amazing and have even moved onto our "Chutta challenges" to challenge themselves further. I just want to say a big well done to everyone in Year 1 for their hard work this week and it has been brilliant to see your effort and commitment to your learning ()

Year 2

This week, Year 2 have been learning all about the traditional tale Rapunzel. After reading through the story, we drew a story map to practice telling to each other. Now we are ready to write our own version of this magical story. Ask us at home to recount the story using our actions and best storytelling voice. In maths, we have using lots of different equipment to practice our place value skills. Practice at home working out which amounts are more or less – perhaps play the game 'Would You Rather'. In topic, we created our own castles by collaging different shapes. We're ready for the weekend after all our hard work!

Year 3

The children have been continuing with their work on place value in Maths focussing on adding and subtracting in 1s, 10s and 100s. Don't forget this can be practised along with other aspects of Maths at home- instead of using Numbots, the children from Year 3 onwards will be using TT Rockstars which is another online platform. As always, Read Write Inc is continuing for some whilst the others are looking at a book called 'Tell Me a Dragon.' The focus in this book is the use of metaphors, similes and extended noun phrases. In English, the children have continued to look at features within a humorous story called 'Diary of a Killer Cat' and beginning to write their own diary entries. Work on the Predator topic has looked at the idea of a food chain and features of creatures considered as predators and prey.

Year4

This week in Year 4, we have focused our English lessons on studying the grammar and punctuation that Anne Fine uses in 'Diary of a Killer Cat'. At the end of the week, we began to plan our own versions using the text as a model. In Maths, we have continued our work within Number & Place Value, in particular, using number lines. This has proven to be very tricky so anything you can do at home would be amazing to help with our learning! Look at us during our RE lesson; we were using dictionaries to find meanings of words that we were unsure of.

Year 5

Year 5 have had an amazing week! We have been off exploring Egypt again! In English, we have continued reading the Secrets of a Sun King, in addition to another Egyptian tale, Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx. In Maths, we have been learning about place value and in particular rounding numbers. We hope the children have enjoyed this week, as much as we have! We are looking forward to our Class Social on Tuesday.

Year 6

Year 6 children worked hard and showed determination when completing their tests. It was wonderful to see how hard they tried to show me what they know. In English, we have learned how to describe characters and settings effectively using a variety of ways, including figurative language. In Maths, we have consolidated ordering and comparing numbers. Part of the children's Science learning was to look at classifying things into groups according to their common characteristics and creating classification keys. In RE, we explained how different people believe in God and discussed the meaning of words such as: theist, and agnostic. Thank you for your hard work year 6.

Parking outside the school

Yellow zig-zag lines outside schools indicate the length of road where stopping or waiting is *strictly prohibited.*
