Messages from Teachers

Foundation

The children have been super busy this week! Today we have been printing gingerbread men with the paint. The children are doing really well in Number Time and are getting really confident at talking about number and what they notice.

Year 1

This week the children have adapted the story "Where the Wild Things Are" and created a plan to use in their big independent write. After creating our plan, the children did just that and spent two lessons writing their own version and then going through their work to check and correct any mistakes. Fantastic effort by all. In maths we have started looking at shapes - both 3d and 2d. We explored their names, appearance, sides, faces etc. We also had ago at drawing them ourselves! This week we have also had discussions around bullying, continued exploring dinosaurs and looked at the creature of the world from a Christian point of view. As always, an amazing week had by all $\textcircled{\textcircled{a}}$

Year 2

In English, we are learning to write independently using our class story to help us! Our challenge has been to add description and an exciting plot! In maths we are practising subtraction which has been quite tricky. We're also learning our 2 times table off by heart so please test us. In Topic, we have been drawing portraits of ourselves holding an object that represents us. In PE, we are practising jumping whilst maintaining our balance.

Year 3

It has been a busy week continuing with work on a character description in English for Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The children have come up with some wonderfully descriptions of a sixth golden ticket winner for the story making them sound really unpleasant! In Maths, we have continued with using the column method in addition and subtraction problems. And in science we have continued with our topic of Scrumdiddlyumptious looking at different food groups and designing contents of or own lunchboxes.

Year4

In English, we have been planning then writing our own stories based on the 'Firework-Maker's Daughter'. We have had great fun coming up with different versions of the story and sharing them with one another. In Maths, we have looked at exchanging in addition and subtraction. Subtraction has been trickier, so we will continue to work on this. In French this week, we learnt about our family! Ask me who I live with to test my knowledge.

Year 5

This week has been the final week of our English topic, based on the book, The Jamie Drake Equation. The children have written some brilliant science fiction stories and have published them into the best. We hope lots of people will have the opportunity to read them.

Our maths, has led to us multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. As the week has progressed our confidence has soared and we have been using our knowledge and understanding to problem solve.

We are really loving the opportunity to work with the teachers at Marjons on a Friday, each week we are learning new skills and applying them.







Year 6

This week in year 6, the children have written their own non- chronological report about their chosen polar animal. As a class, we have learned lots of facts about a variety of animals. In RE, we have discussed the creation story and the children created their own storyboards. As this week was the Antibullying Week, we have spent time in class to discuss what is `mean`, `rude`, and `bullying`. Children have looked at a variety of scenarios and decided whether that was an example of bullying or being malicious or rude. They have written acrostic poems about showing a variety of ways to be kind like: caring, being helpful, friendship, respect and compassion. Well done year 6 for your hard work this week.

Stuart Road Primary Academy Safer School Streets day

We're working together with Plymouth City Council's Road Safety team, Plymotion teams and Sustrans to hold a **one-day trial** of a **Safer School Streets scheme** on **Monday, 22nd November 2021.**

A Safer School Street is where a road outside a school temporarily closes to **school-run and through motor traffic** during drop off and pick up times. This opens the street up to families travelling actively, making it safer to walk, cycle or scoot to school by tackling the main road safety concern that parents raise with us – the amount of traffic on the road during drop off and pick up times

The Safer School Streets day will be held on **Monday**, **22**nd **November** where **Palmerston Street** will be closed to motorised traffic between **8.15am – 9.00am drop off times** and **2.00pm and 3.30pm pick up times**.

Please support the school with this initiative and chose to walk, cycle or scoot from home, or if this is not possible, to park a short distance away and walk, cycle or scoot the remaining distance. <u>During the closure times motorised vehicles will be prevented from entering the road closure</u>. We will be able to offer exemptions, if approved by the school in advance, for a valid reason such as mobility considerations and for residents living within the closure.

The Safer School Streets initiative is a trial and we would be grateful for feedback from pupils, families, local residents and staff in order to inform future decisions.

School Streets is an initiative which is being adopted by a growing number of schools across the nation. Not only will it improve road safety, but will also help to address traffic and parking concerns outside schools and encourage more people to think differently about how they travel to school. It will create a healthier, more liveable street environment around the school and local community, encouraging a reduction of car use and making the vicinity of the school community safer and cleaner, improving the quality of life for everyone.

Safer School Streets is also part of Plymouth City Council's Climate Emergency Action Plan and is supported by Councillor Jonathan Drean, Cabinet Member for Transport and is being delivered in partnership with Sustrans, the charity making it easier for people to walk and cycle.
