EYFS: the disco is in school time from 2pm - 3pm and children can wear mufti to school for this day.


Year 1, 2 and Year 3: 4.30pm to 5.45pm.

Foundation

As well as continuing with Read Write Inc and the theme of the Billy Goats Gruff it appears that the Big Bad Wolf has returned! The children have spotted signs of the Big Bad Wolf returning to our school and as a consequence been busy plotting how to catch him! They have tried really hard in setting traps and lying in wait for him. They have also left notes to entice him into their traps. Alas, Foundation Class were unsuccessful this time, but you will never know with our class! Iyla has been awarded the Head Teacher's Award this week for her fantastic continuation of her home learning. She has continued to practice her number and writing work on MS Teams as well as Numbots - awesome work!

Year 1

This week the children have been really resilient and put huge amounts of effort into the assessments we have been undertaking. They want to do well and show what they can do has been amazing and all the children should be incredibly proud of this. Alongside this we have continued with our Read Write Inc learning and the children have again, like always, shown a real commitment to improving their understanding in reading and their sounds. Finally, we have also begun to create our own version of the 'Colour Monster' and we are excited to share them with you soon.

Year 2

This week was another week of hard work for year 2. In English, we explored the story` The Day the Crayons Quit` and looked at persuasive features in letter writing. We are practising adding and subtracting within word problems and reasoning tasks in maths. In RE, we have asked ourselves what people can learn for the Muslim holy words. We had a fun Science session where we explored why bubbles are round and investigated making bubble with different wands. Great work year 2!

Year 3

This week the children have shown an amazing attitude to their summer assessments. They have shown how much they have learned this year and I'm incredibly proud of all of them. We have continued with cricket in PE with the much-anticipated lesson, batting! In our geography lesson we planned out our road trip of states we are going to visit during this unit.

Year4

Year 4 have been delving deeper into American History and were introduced to the very inspiring and empowering Martin Luther King Jr this week. In English, we have watched his famous 'I have a dream' speech and put ourselves in the shoes of the spectators. We were all in awe at how determined he was to change their lives for the better.

In Maths, we have looked at symmetry! We have been busy cutting out both regular and irregular shapes and identifying why things are or aren't symmetrical.

In topic, we have continued our road trip across the USA and have explored the state names, matching them to their abbreviations as well as the original tribes that settled within them.

Year 5

This week, Year 5 have travelled back in time to Tudor times where a plot to kill the monarch was thwarted. These dramatic events have been written up as stories in the style of Spy Master, our class text, ready to share with their Year 6 teacher Mrs Ioja. In maths, we have finished learning about shape and spent a fun final few lessons exploring 3D shapes in our classroom as well as making a variety of polyhedrons. In Topic, we learned to sing Greensleeves, a love letter written to Ann Boleyn by Henry VIII, and managed to sing a three-part harmony!

Year 6 this week have finished their internal SATS! They have all worked incredibly hard and they have done wonderfully! They are all looking forward to the next 4 weeks of project-based work!

Information for parents

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, **you should inform the school and organise for your child to be tested** via the <u>NHS online portal</u> or by calling 119. Your household should isolate until you receive the test results giving the all clear.

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are a recent onset of:

- New continuous cough/and/or
- High temperature and/or
- A loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19. Do:

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
